



Frangipani Aura exhibition is featuring contemporary artists from Asia and Europe who express their blossoming vision of nature interlaced by urban environment or their intimate spaces. The artists explore different mediums such as painting, collages and ceramic.

From the tropical shelters of Emi Avora to the dynamic jungles of Tunku Khalsom or the fleeting colorful collages of the Korean artist Young-Suk Lefevre we are invited to an immersive journey and an hedonist experience of nature.

We chance upon to discover for the 1st time in Singapore the French artist Chourouk Hriech deeply influenced by her travels around the world and her poetic vision of itinerary.

Emi Avora (b.1979, Greece) is a London-trained and Singapore based artist.

In 2022 She has exhibited in Singapore at Influencers in Alliance Française of Singapore, Solo exhibition with Intersections Gallery at Fullerton Hotel Gallery and Fauna Allegoria exhibitions in 63 Upper Art Gallery.

She has exhibited widely in the UK and abroad. Solo projects include the National Theater of Greece Athens, South Square Arts Center, The Apartment Gallery, Athens, Greenberg Van Doren Gallery, New York and Gallery Trüebenbach and Cologne. She has participated in a number of group shows including Studio Voltaire, London, The National Museum of Contemporary Art, Athens, The Whitechapel Gallery, London and the Macedonian Museum of Contemporary Art, Thessaloniki.

Her work can be found in private as well as public collections in Europe and the USA, including The Wonderful Fund collection and March collection. She has also been an Elizabeth Greenshields recipient and her work has been in various publications including ArtMaze Magazine, the New York Times, Future Now, Aesthetica Magazine and Defining the Contemporary and The Whitechapel in Association with Sotheby's. Her paintings are marked by an emphasis on colour, line and Grecian influence. Emi lives and works in Singapore.



Artist statement:

"The rich history of painting can often be a burden for a painter, something to battle with in order to create something new. Instead, I consider it a comforting asset. I am really drawn to the idea of re-imagining reality which is essentially what the Fauvists and other Post-Impressionists did. They transcended their everyday by simple formal means like heightened color and warped perspective and made it into a poetic, dreamlike gesture."

Born in France in 1977 and graduated from the Ecole des Beaux-Arts in Lyon (France), Chourouk Hriech has been practicing drawing exclusively in black and white, photography, installation, video and performance since the early 2000s. Like a walk through space and time, her works call for the contemplation of ancient and recent architecture, real and imaginary, characters, animals, plants and chimeras that live in a world always in motion, crossed by flows.

A surveyor of the world, Chourouk Hriech always observes it with her camera in hand and her senses alert, collecting data on a territory by taking photographs of its habitat, its population, its plant and animal species, the light that radiates it, the sounds that inhabit it.

She has exhibited in international exhibitions and her works is part of public and private collections in Europe, US and Asia





Khalsom is an international artist of British and Malaysian descent who has been living in Singapore for over ten years. An Interior Architecture graduate (2006), Khalsom has a background in design, but in recent years has been firmly focused on her dynamic art.

Khalsom's works have been exhibited at the Affordable Art Fair (Singapore). Her artworks are in the homes of private collectors in Singapore, Malaysia, London,

USA, Brunei, Australia, and Greece. She is represented by Addicted Gallery in Singapore and By Art Beyond in Paris. Her recent Solo Show in January 2021 was held in Artitude GalleriaSG in Dempsey, Singapore



Artist statement:

There is nothing more wonderful than looking up at a vast expansive sky, it is colours constantly changing. My work is an embodiment of change. Colour, movement, motion, both subtle and strong expressed through brushstrokes, textures and a kaleidoscope of butterflies taking you through that transformation from sunrise to sunset.

"Honestly I first was introduced to Modernist painters when I was at school in Malaysia. My love for colour started when I was very young. It wasn't until I was a teenager and living in London that I got to visit and appreciate the classical painting."

Chloé Manasseh is a British Artist based in Singapore and currently working between Europe and Asia. She completed her Master in Fine Arts from The Slade School of Fine Art in 2014, where she was the recipient of the Euan Uglow Memorial Scholarship.

Her work has been exhibited internationally with exhibitions in USA, UK, Italy, Israel and Singapore. She has collaborated extensively with artists, musicians, clothing and interior designers on various projects around the world. Working between painting, print, video and large scale installations and sculptures, her work sits between experience and imagination, and considers the limits of representation in relation to the wholeness of experience.



Artist statement:

"Working between observation and found imagery, my work evokes a sense of exotic escapism, whilst commenting on our inherent compulsion to bring nature indoors. Taking inspiration from intricate patterns, the natural landscape and the wilds of my imagination, my work reflects on how we inhabit space through visual identity. I am interested in the process by which imagination can intrude on physical space, influencing how people establish a connection to it. In unknown environments, spaces are re-negotiated, shaping our memories and identity in the landscape."



Charlotte de Charentenay is a French Ceramic artist born in 1976. She graduated from University in Lyon II and Beaux Arts in France and currently lives and works in Singapore since 2010.. She also has exhibited in collective shows in Hong Kong.

In her series Unknown Reef & Metamorphic Memories the French ceramic sculptor embodies the inner connection of human with nature.

The Unknown Reef series is inspired by a moment looking at the horizon, facing the unknown The pure form, sensual touch of the glazed texture is an invitation to meditate and to dream of a kinder world.



Artist statement:

"In my approach to ceramic art, my constant quest is one of the purity of the form and raw materials evoking the fragility of human nature.

Living and working in Asia since 2010, I find inspiration in the beauty and turmoil of successive

expatriations. My first exhibitions in Hong Kong – "Untitled" and "Uprooted" highlighted this eternal capacity of human nature for adaptation and renewal."



REN ZHENYU

Ren Zhenyu was born in Tianjin in 1976. He graduated in 1999 from the Oil Painting Department at Tianjin Academy of Fine Art where he is currently working as lecturer. Since the beginning of his career his great talent has been recognized and appreciated by galleries and collectors throughout China. More recently he also has gained fame in Europe, especially through his portrait series of two historical icons: Andy Warhol and Chairman Mao. In this series, Ren plays with colours and China's most famous image, abstract-expressionist expressing his own interpretation of the Chairman's face portrayed from different angles. Far from neo-realism, he belongs to the trend of pop-political art and by choosing Mao his subject, Ren attempts not only to celebrate Mao's image from a contemporary perspective, but he also aims to reconcile some very dolorous and uncomfortable memories.


